A SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

I BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The deferred tax asset is recognized and carried forward only to the extent that there is a virtual certainty that the assets will be realized in future.

6 PROVISION .CONTINGENT LIABILITIES AND CONTINGENT ASSETS

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources.
